Dear St. Luke & Penryn Families,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen. As I write this greeting in the middle of December, the Penryn church is FREEZING COLD! Like the boiler, I never gave it much thought until I sat in my freezing cold office.

Since our commitment to be bound together by a called pastor in July, St. Luke and Penryn have come together in many different ways. Our gifts and talents have been pulled together to further God’s mission in community. We share a prayer circle, food ministries are working together to share volunteers and resources, church members have been pulling resources to support community members in crisis, the ministry of music is being expanded... All of these varied parts with different gifts are being shared to glorify God! It is a beautiful and life-giving thing to witness!

As we begin a new year, I invite you all to consider what your part is within the church. There are no insignificant parts – they all matter, and they are all needed. If your gift is math, engineering, management, teaching, music, or holding people in prayer – the church needs you! We wouldn’t be who we are without you. Each and every one of us makes us complete. We collectively are the body of Christ.



St. Paul Financial and Penryn Food Pantry Reports

Financial Report:

2023 has been a challenging year for our congregation. Despite economic pressure on every household, our members continued to support the ministries at St. Paul. Through the end of November, it looked like expenses for the year would be below budgeted figures despite higher-than-expected utility and insurance costs. On December 4, we found ourselves needing to replace a furnace at a cost of \$15,471. Within a week we received donations of \$3,000 for this unbudgeted, unplanned expense. This initial response to a need is what defines the St. Paul congregation. On November 19, the congregation approved the 2024 budget of \$143,470, which represents a 2 % increase from 2023. We expect to receive 40%, or \$56,595 in income to support this budget from St. Luke, the Breittegan Trust, the Backyard, and pension contributions from Pastor Angie. That leaves \$86,875 to be raised to meet the adopted budget, which translates to \$1,671 a week or \$7,240 a month in offering. Regular giving from members and friends of the congregation is vital to meeting these goals.

During the past year more members and community members have taken the opportunity to give online. This option benefits St. Paul with a more consistent flow of funds. Contributors benefit from less checks to write, trying to “catch up” when missing a worship service. Depending on how they set up online giving (credit card or bank draft), donors could possibly receive rewards from their financial institution. Anyone interested in donating online on a recurring or one-time basis can find a link on St. Paul’s website, stpaulpenryn.org.


Penryn Food Pantry Update:

In November, we served 270 seniors (folks 60+) and 471 children (kids 0 - 17 years old). In the past four months (Aug 23 - Nov 23), we served 94 NEW families.

The community we serve proves to be grateful. It is not uncommon for folks who use the pantry to offer something back, whether it is a couple of cans of beans or some extra Tylenol that they got with a medication card or a twenty-dollar bill, which they say isn't much but they just want to give back something.

Please consider volunteering on Wednesday evenings anytime between 5:00-8:00 PM, and on Saturday morning anytime between 9:00am-12:00 PM. A few extra people make a BIG difference!
